Klara Strompf, born in Hungary, is an economist, the mother of two adult sons and now lives in Germany. Since 1996 she has been participating in a project in her town of residence Mörfelden-Walldorf, together with the local museum director Cornelia Rühlig, the town council and town parliament, the City of Frankfurt and the Frankfurt Airport Authority (Fraport). She wrote and published *Hungarian Jewish Women in KZ Walldorf in 1944* in both English and Hungarian. They have found 65 survivors of this camp living around the world and have helped them to get financial and emotional compensation. She sees herself as a bridge-builder between both generations of Jews and Germans to keep continuous proactive dialogues. She is a strong believer in the tremendous power of education and its role in forming the life philosophy of the young new generation in Germany.
